## A PARTIAL LIST OF BUILDINGS CONSTRUCTED

## WHOLLY OR IN PART OF HUMMELSTOWN BROWNSTONE

It must be emphasized that the following lists are partial and in no way represent the entire output of the Hummelstown quarries. Indeed, such a listing would be gigantic. In addition, determining exactly which structures are listed on the National Register of Historic Places or that lie within the confines of an historic district is difficult and time consuming to complete as well as being subject to frequent change. Consequently, those structures identified herein as having a connection with the National Register are certainly not the only Hummelstown structures listed by that organization. Rather, these lists should give one a general idea as regards the distribution of the stone, the types of structures that it built, the extent to which they are extant or demolished, and the regard in which they are held by the National Park Service which is the agency that administers and oversees the National Register of Historic Places.

E - Indicates extant structures as of 2001

D - Indicates demolished structures or ones destroyed by fire or flood

? - Indicates a question as to whether or not the structure is extant

Red indicates that the structure is listed on the National Register of Historic Places or lies within the boundaries of an Historic District established by the National Park Service.
